YCAR's primary mandate is to support and carry out research, both collaborative and individual; to disseminate research findings to scholarly communities through research events and publications; to promote research with diverse external audiences through communication, events and engagement; to support the professional training of graduate student researchers; and to foster exchanges and linkages with Asian institutions. Supporting faculty and staff appointments and helping to develop library materials are other primary activities. YCAR cooperates with Canadian and overseas institutions to improve interchange with government, business, community groups and NGOs

and to promote research-informed public debate on Asia and Asia-Canada linkages. In addition to scholarly study, Centre Associates may be involved in applied research and such professional practices as training and consulting on Asia and Asian Diasporas.

6. Annual Progress in Fulfilling Mandate

In fiscal 2011.2012, YCAR was a very active community of scholars of diverse Faculties and disciplines with a shared interest in the study of Asia and Asian diaspora. The Centre's 143 Associates included 55 Faculty Associates from six York Faculties, 41 Graduate Associates from five York Faculties, as well as 27 Research Associates (external researchers), four Senior Research Associates, four Visiting Scholars and two Visiting Graduate Associates. YCAR Associates were associated with more than 33 scholarly disciplines. In 2012.2012, the Centre welcomed 16 new Associates (two Faculty Associates, seven Graduate Associates, two Research Associates, five visitors).

The year was very busy with activities related to YCAR's primary goals related to advancing scholarly research. The Centre also housed one professional training programme. Key accomplishments and initiatives are highlighted below (see Appendix I for details).

(a) **Research:** YCAR supported the development of several new and ongoing faculty-led research projects with administrative time, the provision of space and small amounts of money. As part of this effort, YCAR worked with Faculty Associates to submit 15 grant proposals, most for collaborative initiatives. Ten proposals were to external funders, five of which were successful (two were pending and two were unsuccessful). YCAR began administering two new externally funded projects and programmes: an Asia Pacific Foundation-funded international workshop on the impacts of non-state diplomacies on Canada-Asia relations explored possibilities for collaborative research and an SSHRC Creation Grant is supporting production of a documentary film on the transnational movement of the Ati-atihan festival, which originated in the central Philippines. The Centre administered a total of 11 externally funded projects and programmes, seven of which used space at the Centre. Asia Research Day in January 2012 provided a workshop setting in which Associates presented work in progress including plans for new projects. The publications and other culminating works for YCAR-based projects are listed under the individual reports of the PIs (see Appendix II).

(b) **Dissemination:** YCAR organized, (co-)sponsored or supported 28 diverse research events, including public and project/programme-related seminars, talks, panels, a film festival, as well as community-building and publication promotion events. The events also included six workshops, symposia and conferences. Amongst them were three international workshops that YCAR is helping to develop into larger research collaborations: on critical political ecologies in Asia, which will result in a special issue of the journal *Conservation and Society*, the previously mentioned workshop on non-state diplomacies in

Canada-Asia relations, the concept paper for which is under review for a special issue of the *Canadian Foreign Policy Journal*, and on oriental modernity and modern design histories in East Asia.

(c) **Promotion and mobilization:** In 2011.2012, YCAR strengthened its ability to promote and mobilize research with new or improved communication tools and initiatives. It held the first publications celebration, launched a Facebook page and began publishing the *Asia Colloquia Papers* series. Planning got well underway for a new YCAR web site with new technical features and a communications strategy that will draw in more users and better promote YCAR-related research. The Centre continued to publish its *Research Snapshots* sub-series (with the KM unit), the YCAR *Update* newsletter and maintained an active list-serv with 300 external subscribers beyond those at York.

(d) **Professional development of graduate student researchers:** YCAR regards the training of the next generation of Asia/Asian diaspora researchers as central to its mandate. As such, in 2011.2012, it supported their development as researchers through five awards for Asian language training and field/archival work (and secured ongoing funding for one award); providing space to 10 students; involving 18 in faculty projects as assistants or researchers; having eight students write *Research Snapshots*; mentoring seven in their capacities as YCAR GAs and RAs. Five students completed the YCAR-administered Graduate Diploma in Asian Studies, while there were nine new enrollments. Visiting Scholar and CRC Abidin Kusno led a special student workshop, which six students attended. YCAR prepared and submitted to the LA&PS Dean a 10-year teaching plan for the GDAS core course, having previously secured the Faculty's five-year commitment (beginning in 2010.2011) to mount the course and assist in securing faculty time for the course directorship.

(f) **Developing external partnerships and linkages:** YCAR-based projects actively involved at least eight non-academic partner institutions, 25 external scholars and one scholarly partner. Additionally, two Faculty Associates visited the Chinese Academy of Social Science (CASS) for a joint CASS-York University conference. Collaborative research on multiethnic accommodation in Asia and Canada will be explored when YCAR receives a Visiting Scholar from CASS in 2012.2013. YCAR began developing a research initiative with the Greater Mekong Sub-region Study Center, Yunnan University, China, the Director of which is currently a YCAR Visiting Scholar.

(f) **Professional training:** The YCAR-based ABMP Training Division had its busiest training year to date and, in partnership with the Beijing Foreign Experts Bureau, conducted the second year of a research project on the impact of its training programmes over 10 years.

Notes to Statement of Operations

Administration | Administration expenses were originally the stipend and benefits of the ABMP Executive Director only (Actuals for this expense will be \$5,750). Additionally, the YCAR Executive Committee approved on 23 September 2011 a payment of \$6,000 to Sonja Regler for her research assistance on the 'Ten Years Training Chinese Officials at York University: An Evaluation' project. Moreover, the cost centre reimbursed the Training Division \$3,500 in this fiscal year for research assistance work done by Regler in 2010.2011, which had been approved by the YCAR Executive Committee in the 2010.2011 Endowment Budget.

Research and Development | This includes a \$25,000 transfer to the YCAR Operating Fund and \$7,000 to the YCAR Asia Projects Fund for Strategic Initiatives.

Carryforward | This amount was to help cover possible shortfalls in the disbursement of Endowment earnings in the 2012.2013 fiscal year.

Notes to Statement of Operations

Revenues | YCAR received an additional \$5,000 in overheads from the Training Division, \$308 more in project revenues and \$600 in donations, which were unanticipated. Note that \$25,000 were transferred from the YCAR Endowment so were not new monies.

Expenses | A portion of the Research Assistant's salary from 2011.2012 for hours worked in April 2011 will be paid out in 2012.2013.

Administration | A web site designer was not hired and salary and benefits for a Research Assistant were lower than the amount budgeted for a Graduate Assistant.

Research and Development | Expenses were lower than expected as we only purchased web cams and software. Funds budgeted for a computer (\$1,200), camera (\$246) and language testing (\$200) were not used. The budgeted annual transfer of funds for the YCAR Language Award (\$5,000) to the Asia Projects Fund was not done because the funds were not needed for current awards expenses.

Carryforward | This amount was to help cover projected losses of normal revenues in the 2012.2013 fiscal year.

Notes to the Statement of Operations

Revenues | \$7,000 in revenues is a transfer from the YCAR Endowment, so were not new monies. This category includes \$500 internal transfer from FGS for the 2012.2013 graduate student conference that was received in fiscal 2011.2012.

Expenses | Expenses in this Fund comprise the budget items from the various allocated and unallocated funds located in the larger Asia Projects Fund. As we did not have all plans when budgeting, we could not fully anticipate all expenses, as in past years.

Note that monies budgeted for specific initiatives appear in more than one expense category.

Spending was lower than expected in part because YCAR did not go ahead with the Strategic Initiatives initiative in 2011.2012 (\$11,000).

Catering expenses for a 2011.2012 workshop (\$2,300) will be reimbursed to this cost centre in 2012.2013.

Carryforward | YCAR only has spending discretion over some of the funds in the cost centre. To understand the implications of this, note that funds in this cost centre are allocated or unallocated. Allocated funds are funds attached to specific research areas or to projects or to specific researchers for specified research activities.

YCAR has discretion over approximately \$66,304 of the allocated monies in the cost centre. These funds were allocated for the following activities (among other smaller amounts): Strategic Initiatives (\$21,000); Research Programme and Project Development (\$25,075); Support for YCAR Faculty Research

Initiatives (\$6,000 of which all but \$300 was spent); and Support for YCAR Associate Initiatives (\$2,000, none of which was spent) (*All amounts as of 30 April 2012*). Approximately \$8,026 in the cost centre is currently unallocated. YCAR also has discretion over these funds.

The Carryforward to 2012.2013 will help to cover any shortfalls during 2012.2013 fiscal year.

8. Objectives for Upcoming Year

YCAR anticipates a busy year in 2012.2013 and some important changes and challenges. As a search for a new Director is underway (for a term beginning 1 July 2012), some objectives and plans for the coming year have not yet been finalized. It is anticipated that the AMBP Training Division may move out of YCAR in the coming year. If this occurs, YCAR will likely lose the associated programme overheads, a significant source of YCAR's annual operating revenues for a decade. As such, YCAR would need to identify new sources of operating revenue, looking to potential collaborative research grants and other sources (see Financial Accountability above).

(a) **Funding proposals:** In 2012.2013, the Centre anticipates supporting external grant applications for at least nine projects and programmes, both new and existing. These will include at least three SSHRC Insight Grants, two SSHRC Insight Development Grants, four SSHRC Connection Grants and one Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada and others. The Centre will also develop a plan for intensifying efforts to support proposals for larger collaborative initiatives that can secure external funding.

(b) **Dissemination events:** The Centre will be organizing four externally funded international workshops aimed at developing books (on human rights and the arts in global Asia, Asian Diaspora youth in the aftermath of conflict, Philippine youth in Canada and Korean educational migration). Partnering with the Asia Pacific Foundation, YCAR will also organize a workshop on Canadian Aboriginal connections with Chinese extractive industry investors. Should Korea Foundation funding be secured, 2012.2013 will be the first of a three-year international Speaker Series, an important step in building ties with this prominent funder. Plans are underway for a fall Asia Lecture to celebrate YCAR's tenth anniversary.

(c) **Knowledge Mobilization/Engagement/Outreach:** YCAR's priority will be to finalize and implement plans for its new web site. It will also work on expanding its Facebook page audience; publish and promote four to six issues of the *Asia Colloquia Papers* series; if the KM unit has the editorial capacity, publish and promote four to six *Research Snapshots*; and include more "live" links in the *Update* newsletter. The Centre has preliminary agreement with the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada for a Fall 2012 student event associated with the National Conversation on Asia, co-organized with the Department of Political Science. It will finalize a "best practices" report, for use in strengthening the Centre's KM/Engagement/Outreach work.

(d) **Support for student professional development:** In addition to YCAR's normal activities, some exceptional initiatives are planned. The YCAR Director will lead a delegation of students from York, University of Toronto and Wilfrid Laurier University on a Taiwan study trip sponsored by the Taiwan government. Plans are underway for a student researcher conference for February 2013. A review of the GDAS core course will focus on course content and supplementary activities and the potential impact of holding the 2013.2014 course in the spring/summer term.

(e) **Professional training:** ABMP Training Division expects to teach 25 groups in 2012.2013 on a diversity of subjects and in diverse delivery locations. The programme may move from YCAR in 2012.2013.

(f) **Visitors:** YCAR expects to host five Visiting Scholars, two of whom require space: Mie Kyung Jae (Professor, Human Counseling and Welfare, Inje University, Korea)("Cross-cultural comparison of the ethical consumer behaviours of Korean and Canadian consumers with respect to their participation in consumer boycotts"), 1 May 2012 to 31 January 2013 (continuing); Abidin Kusno (Associate Professor,

Institute of Asian Research and Canada Research Chair in Asian Urbanism and Culture-Tier II, UBC)(“Remaking Jakarta: Changes in urban politics”), 1 May 2012 to 30 August 2012 (continuing); Xing Lu (Associate Professor and Director of the Greater Mekong Sub-region Study Center, Yunnan University, China)(“Media Representation of the Xayaburi Dam: A Case Study of Thai English Newspapers in Comparative Perspective”), 1 September to 30 November 2012 (continuing); Xinying Wang (Associate Research Fellow, Center for Overseas Studies on China, Central Compilation and Translation Bureau of China)(“The Comparative Study on Social Management of Canada and China: The Perspective of Population Registration and Statistics”), 1 May 2012 to 31 August 2012 (continuing); Shaoqing Zhou (Associate Professor, Institute of Ethnology and Anthropology, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, China)(“Ethno-national Minority Rights Protection in the Framework of Multiculturalism: China in Comparative Perspective”), 1 May 2012 to 30 April 2013 (new).
